**Question of the Week:**

What "signs" in your life have led you to Jesus?

PASTOR'S CORNER

Our Bishops have once more named this National Migration Week. They do that at this time of the year because the Holy Family migrated to Egypt and the Magi were moving in search of the real Good News. It comes as no news to many of you that Immigration Reform is something I care deeply about because it affects the lives of many of our fellow parishioners. That is why I mention it so often. It may also be worthwhile to acknowledge two obvious points. This is a contentious issue. This is an issue that is even more contentious in other places in the world (e.g. Europe).

I quote from the booklet recently produced by the Bishops Conference:

Throughout his ministry, Jesus is portrayed as a migrant: a teacher and healer traveling through Judea and Samaria to share his message of love, welcome, and salvation for all people.

He had no place of his own and relied on the hospitality of others for his and his disciples' needs. Jesus establishes the love and care we show for strangers as the standard by which we shall be judged: "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me" (Mt 25:35).

Flowing from the scriptural tradition and the personal witness of Jesus, three principles came to inform Church teaching on this issue:

1) People have the right to migrate to sustain their lives and the lives of their families.

2) A country has the right to regulate its borders and to control migration.

3) A country must regulate its borders with justice and mercy.

People of faith must seek a way of balancing their valid security needs while at the same time striving to meet the basic human needs of others, including those who are foreign born. It is in

ST. PETER IN CHAINS SCHOOL*

The first grade class started off the month of November by honoring All Saints Day with a class presentation entitled, "When the Saints Go Marching In." Each student was assigned a particular Saint to research at home with his or her family. They selected one fact about their Saint and presented this fact to their fellow classmates and eighth grade buddies. The first graders did an incredible job, showing honor to their Saint and growing in their faith.

The third graders have begun learning multiplication facts. They have studied the 2, 4, 5 and 10 times tables. Varieties of activities are used to help learn these facts such as games, practice with flash cards, and timed drill sheets. The students have discovered that multiplication is fun and easy to learn! Another exciting subject for third grade is learning cursive. They are ALMOST finished learning the lower case letters. Once finished, the students will begin completing school work in cursive.

On Tuesday, December 17th the students in grades K-3 performed The Nativity. In the afternoon the group performed for the school and later that evening for their parents and other guests. Everybody did a fabulous job!! Grayce Sieg and Katie Schwartz sang solos during the song, Away in the Manger, and Grace Warner did a solo ballet dance! We are thankful that these girls were
