PASTOR'S CORNER

TAMI URCIA

It was our pleasure to welcome Tami Urcia to the Pastoral Staff this weekend. Tami's office on the third floor was completely redone thanks to "super volunteer" Ron Vidourek. As he has done to other places in the church and office building, Ron stripped the door down to the bare wood. It is a thing to behold.

Tami will be the point person on our new Lenten program *Living the Eucharist*. Among the levels of involvement will be small groups. Tami will get to know us better by forming the groups and working with group leaders. This can be a help to her as she begins to shape the Family Ministry which is her main area.

COMMUNION UNDER BOTH SPECIES

Several weeks ago I announced that during the flu and cold season we will discontinue offering the cup at Mass. The Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion must consume the Precious Blood that remains. In addition, either the deacons or I must purify the chalices before they are cleansed with soap and water. It is simply prudent to discontinue Holy Communion under both species for during the height of the season.

I regularly remind the ministers to use hand sanitizer if they will be ministering the Body of Christ.

COLLECTION ENVELOPES

St. Joseph, St. Peter in Chains, and St. Julie Billiart parishes will make sure that if someone drops an envelope from one of the other parishes in the collection, it will be sent on to the parish whose name appears on the envelope.

It is entirely possible that in three and a half years when there is just one priest for the three parishes, it will be even more common for folks to, at least on occasion, attend Mass at one of the other parishes.

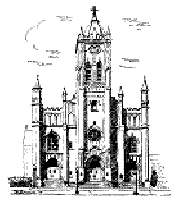
