PASTOR'S CORNER

A parishioner recently returned from some time in Ireland and brought me the bulletin from the “Killarney Parish”. If you don’t recognize the name, you may have heard of the Ring of Kerry. That is the beautiful road around the circumference of the Kerry Peninsula. The bulletin is from the “Killarney Parish” because of three parishes of the Peninsula now share a single pastor.

I bring this to your attention to point out that the “vocation crisis” is not just a local or even just a U.S. phenomenon. Unfortunately, even Ireland, which used to send hundreds of priests abroad every year, faces a scarcity of priests.

There are two things we can and should do about that. First, we can pray. That is one of the goals of Vocation Week. Another goal is to encourage men to consider serving God in this way. Priesthood has always been a “minority” vocation. However, fifty years ago, when I was a senior in high school, I knew that there were already ten or so young men from the area in the seminary high school. In addition, I knew that each year from the graduating class of Elder at least five went to the college seminary to join those moving on from the seminary high school. In other words, while few young men were seriously considering priesthood, there was a clear number who were. That is not always the case now days. That means we have to be “encouragers” of priestly vocations. Parents and grandparents have a great influence on their children and grandchildren by what they affirm in them.

Also, the vocation crisis is leading us to plan for the time when there will be only one priest for St. Joseph, St. Julie, and St. Peter parishes. This will happen when I retire from being pastor in 2017. Please make sure you read the regular messages from the Pastoral Region Planning Committee.



Servant of God, Father Augustus Tolton

Cardinal Francis George returned from his ad limina visit to Rome with a decree dated February 14, 2012 issued by the Sacred Congregation for the Causes of Saints bestowing upon Father Augustus Tolton the title, “Servant of God.” On Monday, September 29, 2014, the Office of the Diocesan Postulator announced the completion of the investigation into the life and virtues of the Servant of God, Father Augustus Tolton 1854-



1897, and a ceremony was held sealing and binding the dossier that was dispatched to the Vatican Congregation for Cause of Saints; it was celebrated in the presence of His Eminence, Francis Cardinal George, OMI, Archbishop of Chicago.
