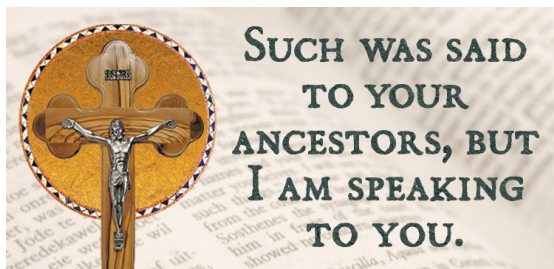

Elsewhere in the bulletin you'll see a "blurb about the evening of Taizé prayer that Trinity Episcopal Church is hosting next Sunday, March 2 at 6:30 pm. Wikipedia states that Taize is an ecumenical monastic order in Taizé, France. It is composed of more than one hundred brothers, from Protestant and Catholic traditions, who originate from about thirty countries across the world. It was founded in 1940 by Brother Roger Schutz, a Protestant.

The community has become one of the world's most important sites of Christian pilgrimage. Over 100,000 young people from around the world make pilgrimages to Taizé each year for prayer, Bible study, sharing, and communal work. Through the community's ecumenical outlook, they are encouraged to live in the spirit of kindness, simplicity and reconciliation.

Taize is a beautiful meditative chanted communal prayer. It is not a concert but a style of prayer in which we all participate. If you have not experienced this type of prayer, I highly recommend it. Trinity Episcopal is just a few blocks east of us at 115 N. 6th. Their phone is 896-6755

*VI I DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO
ORDINARIO*

LECTURAS: Levítico 19: 1-2, 17-18; Salmo 103;
1 Corintios 3:16-23; Mateo 5:38-48.



Soy el Arzobispo Dennis Schnurr.

A medida que nos acercamos a la Cuaresma, tenemos la oportunidad de vivir nuestra fe con mas generosidad; tenemos motivos para invitar a otros a una relación transformadora con Jesucristo; y tenemos la oportunidad de ser una Iglesia, unida alrededor del mundo y a la vez excepcionalmente presente en nuestras comunidades locales, sanando, enseñando y alimentando.

Esta oportunidad es un llamado de Dios. Algunas personas podrían incluso cree que lo que Dios nos pide es un desafío imposible, pero Dios siempre nos da la gracia de seguir Su Llamado. Nuestras lecturas de hoy nos presentan el desafío directamente: estamos llamados a ser santos.

En nuestra primera lectura, tomada del Libro de Levítico, Dios habla al pueblo de Israel cuando salen de su esclavitud en Egipto hacia la Tierra Prometida. “Sean santos”, Dios dice a su pueblo, por medio de Moisés, “porque yo, el Señor, su Dios, son santo”. Después, en el Evangelio, escuchamos el relato de San Mateo del Sermón de la Montaña, donde Jesús dice a quienes lo siguen: “... sean perfectos, como es perfecto el Padre que esta en el cielo”.

Santos y perfectos son probablemente las ultimas cosas que la mayoría de nosotros nos sentimos capaces de lograr o ser. Al igual que los cristianos en Corintios, a quienes se dirige San Pablo en la segunda lectura de hoy, debemos recordad que la santidad no es algo que logramos con nuestro esfuerzo. Santo es quiénes y qué somos, y de quién somos. San Pablo nos dice, “hermanos y hermanas, ¿no saben ustedes que son el templo de Dios...? (y) el templo de Dios, que son ustedes, es santo Todo es de ustedes y ustedes son de Cristo”. ¿Y cómo debemos mostrar esta santidad en nuestra vida diaria? Estas son las instrucciones que Dios les dio a los israelitas en el Antiguo Testamento: “No deben sentir odio por su hermano o hermana en su corazón Deben amar al prójimo como a ustedes mismos”. Da manera semejante, en el Sermón de la Montana, Jesús dice a Sus seguidores, “Den a quien les pida y no den la espalda”. En otras palabras, somos el pueblo de Dios, la Iglesia y como tal debemos ser el amor de Dios visible en el mundo. Pero no podemos realizar esa misión exclusivamente como católicos individuales ni como parroquias individuales. Jesús nos dio la Iglesia porque nos necesitamos unos a otros todos nosotros actuando juntos para continuar con el ministerio del amor de Jesús y para responder fielmente a nuestro llamado al amor.

En su exhortación apostólica “El Gozo de la Evangelización”, el Papa Francisco habla de lo que significa poner a Cristo en el centro de nuestras vidas, de esta manera:

Ser la Iglesia, significa ser el pueblo de Dios, de acuerdo con el gran plan de su amor paternal. Esto significa que somos la levadura de Dios en la humanidad. Significa proclamar y traer la salvación de Dios a nuestro mundo, que a menudo se extravía y al cual se le debe dar aliento, esperanza y fortaleza. (Papa Francisco, Evangelio Gaudium, #214).

El comprometer nuestro apoyo a la Catholic Ministries Appeal (Campaña de Ministerios Católicos) anual, que empieza hoy, respondemos de una manera real y practica a nuestro llamado a la santidad. *En su nombre* los ministerios locales con Cristo como centro, hacen la diferencia en las vidas de miles de personas a lo largo de los diecinueve condados de nuestra Arquidiócesis. Gracias a que usted ama a su prójimo como a usted mismo y no le da la espalda, hay comida en la mesa de familias con hambre, hay madres jóvenes que eligen la vida, niños que encuentran familias y refugiados que encuentran resguardo y acogida.

Hay varios ministerios que reciben apoyo continuo, en nombre de usted a través de la Campana de Ministerios Católicos (Catholic Ministries Appeal). ¡Todo eso son muy buenas nuevas!

Esta semana estoy haciendo una invitación personal de “Catholic Ministries Appeal” de parte mía. Sirvase considerar su respuesta por medio de la oración y comprométase tan generosamente como pueda, aun si no ha dado nada anteriormente a la Catholic Ministries Appeal. Piense en como Dios lo llama para ser santo, para ser la Iglesia, para poner a Cristo como centro.

Que Dios nos fortalezca y nos bendiga a todos nosotros y que nos de alegría y esperanza a través de Catholic Ministries Appeal durante esta temporada santa de Cuaresma y Siempre.
