PASTOR'S CORNER

Today is "World Marriage Day". Surprised? It may not be a surprise that each year it occurs on the Sunday closest to Valentine's Day. But our hope is that couples can grow to appreciate their Christian Marriage as much more than a romantic bond. The Church states that marriage is a sacrament. The priest or deacon is not the minister of the Sacrament. The baptized couple is. And because it is a sacrament it has to do with salvation. The Catechism teaches that there are two sacraments oriented toward the salvation of others as opposed to one's personal salvation: ordination and marriage. Husband and wife hopefully are lovers and best friends. But even more than that, the ideal is that they are vehicles of salvation for each other.

Every couple who ask to celebrate their marriage as a sacrament must sign the "Declaration of Matrimonial Intent":

We, in the presence of one another, individually declare our freedom to marry and our freedom from any known impediments between us. We hold marriage to be a lifelong, faithful union and process of choosing each other for the mutual and total sharing of our life and our love. It is a union which is open to children. It is a union which is modeled after and symbolizes God's ever-faithful love for His people. It is a partnership of the totality of life and love that we seek and to which we will publicly give our consent in marriage.

Clearly in the Church's eyes "getting married in the Church" is much more than asking the priest or deacon to bless the couple.

Thanks to all married couples whose sacrificial love "sacramentalizes" the Lord's sacrificial love for all of us.

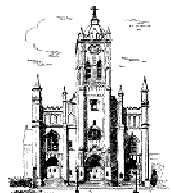

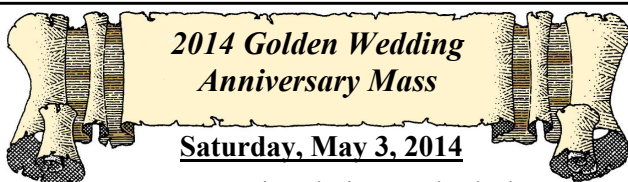
St. Julie Billiart Capital Campaign Drive: Preserving our Past – Preparing for Our Future
