Pastor's *CORNER*

You'll notice bulletin blurbs and radio spots promoting **"The Light is on for You."** This is an effort to reconcile to the Church folks who have been away for some time. Essentially it means that every pastor will be in his respective parish church that evening for two hours to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

When it comes to the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** or **Confession** there are three groups of people I think of. The first group is of those who regularly (at least twice a year) celebrate the Sacrament. Then there are those who, though they are almost always at Sunday Mass, have not celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation for quite some time. Finally, there are those who have been completely away from the Church. **The Light is on for You** is an effort to reach this third group.

I also hope that if you are here most every Sunday, **but have not celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation for a while**, that you avail yourself of the opportunity during Lent. But it may be best if you come some time other than March 16. Again, I'll be the only priest available on March 16. My concern is someone has had little or no contact with the Church, hears the radio spot, walks in that evening, sees a very long line, and figures that is an indication that it is not for them.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is an important part of our Lenten practice. From the priest's point of view, it is a great opportunity to freely give away something of great value. From the penitent's point of view, it is the way to claim Jesus' Death and Resurrection for yourself. We want to make the Sacrament easily available to you:

The communal celebration will be Tuesday evening April 1 at 7:00 pm. Communal celebrations of the Sacrament are also offered at St. Peter in Chains on Thursday April 3 at 7:00 pm, and St. Maximilian Kolbe on Saturday March 29 at 10:00 am. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is always celebrated from 3:00 to 4:00 pm Saturday afternoon.

I am available by appointment.

Finally, I will be in church on Monday evening, April 14 from 7:00 pm until we are finished.

HA LLEGADO LA CUARESMA

Si quieres entrar en el espíritu correcto de la Cuaresma, no hace falta buscar mas allá que en la lectura de Joel 2, 12. Dice allí que Tu Padre celestial es generoso y misericordioso y te está llamando para bendecirte. También es cierto que se habla de “ayunos, lágrimas y llanto”, pero no para inspirar miedo o inseguridad. Esas son cosas que deben brotar espontáneamente del corazón cuando ansias librarte del pecado y del temor de; un corazón que mira a Dios queriendo recibir una mayor porción de amor divino. Solo para recordar, que aparte de la oración, el ayuno y la limosna, hay otras maneras de renovar nuestra vida espiritual en la Cuaresma.

Recuerda que el ayuno también debes practicarlo en tus pensamientos, en tus acciones y en tus palabras. También se sugiere leer diariamente la Sagrada Escritura (las lecturas diarias), lee por unos 10 o 15 minutos y medita en lo que leiste. Has un examen de conciencia día a día, pide perdón por las faltas cometidas y perdona a quienes te hayan ofendido. Es también importante, que participes en la vida sacramental y comunitaria de tu parroquia. La hora Santa, el vía crucis, ayuda a los necesitados y otras actividades de servicio, te ayudaran a tener una buena Cuaresma.
