PASTOR'S CORNER



It comes as no surprise that attendance at the three Sunday Masses last week was really down, especially the 11:00 Mass. Again, in the very unlikely circumstance that we cancel Mass, we will leave a message on the Parish voicemail. Especially for our older parishioners, I remind you that there is no need to risk a serious fall in getting to Mass.

Because last Sunday was also commitment day for the Catholic Ministry Appeals, we have left the CMA envelopes in the pews this weekend. I hope that you will be able to make a pledge that can sustain these vital ministries. Last year we heard from a parishioner about the importance of Catholic Campus Ministry. This year we heard about St. Rita School for the Deaf. I, for one, appreciate hearing directly from people I know about the importance of some of the ministries supported by the CMA.

Today the Archdiocese of Cincinnati will celebrate the Rite of Election and the Call to Continuing Conversion with 946 adults and children seeking entrance into the Roman Catholic Church. Once more, some of them will be from our Parish.

The Rite of Election is celebrated with those who are unbaptized and preparing to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. The Call to Continuing Conversion is celebrated with those already baptized, but desiring to be received into the Roman Catholic Church. Additionally, baptized Catholics who are completing their initiation through the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist are also called to continuing conversion at this celebration.

In a special way each year Lent is dedicated to the final preparation period of these men, women, and children as they prepare to enter the Church. "Cradle Catholics" may envy these adults the opportunity to embrace the faith with a deeper consciousness of its meaning. But we have the opportunity of participating with them through these rites. They can serve to re-ignite our own faith.

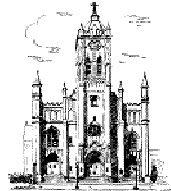

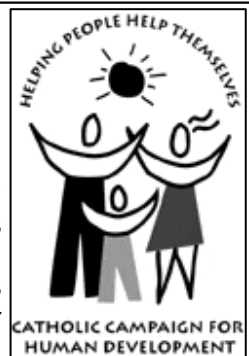


St. Julie's is forming a group who like to knit or crochet.

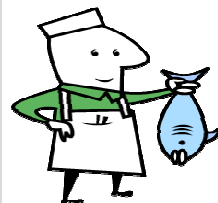

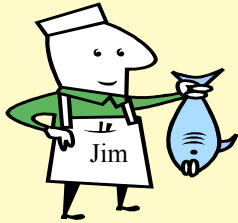
Lenten Morning of Reflection

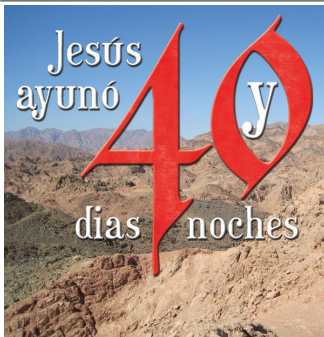
