*PASTOR'S CORNER*

Last Monday Julie Yorn, from the Parish Pastoral Council, and I attended a meeting on church representatives at Faith Community United Methodist Church over on Cox Road. It was an initial meeting to explain what is called the "Interfaith Hospitality Network". Essentially, it is a faith-based response to homeless families. It is a national organization that over the last twenty years or so worked with groups of churches around the country in a creative solution to the continuing reality of homelessness among families.

The program is straightforward and, at the same time, quite sophisticated. Thirteen host churches in Butler County, supported by volunteers from many other churches, would open their doors to five or six families from 6:00 pm to 6:00 am for a week at a time. The program would have a day center for adults to stay while the kids are at school or day care. The adults use the time for job search/preparation or some form of education. The day center is separate from any church.

In the next week or so we'll include a flyer about the program in the Sunday bulletin. How or whether we as a Parish would participate is fully dependent on the interest of all of you. I'd like to give it a good look because:

Homelessness among families in Butler County is a serious issue.

While we rarely have direct contact with homeless families, and this program only deals with parent(s) with children, we do have regular contact with homeless single people. As a downtown Parish, I'd like to see us have some response.

We have facilities that go unused for most evenings.

We are Christian

After the flyer is published in the bulletin, I'll check to see who might be interested in helping in some way. This is far from a "done deal."

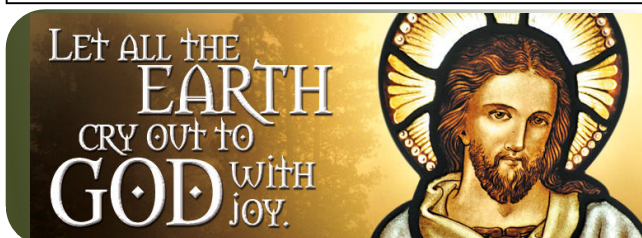

**Week 4 – Fourth in a series of what our  
 Faith Community can do to minister to  
 those with mental illness and their  
 families.**



The dignity of the individual is paramount in our belief that we are all created in the image and likeness of God. Our language should reflect that belief. When talking about mental illness, we need to use “people first language.” We refer to people as the persons they are - not the disease they have. So we say “a person who has a mental illness” or “a man or woman with a mental illness.” We avoid referring to people using terms like “the mentally ill” or “the depressed.” As people of compassion and justice we should never use stigmatizing language or demeaning terms.

Careful use of language is more than being “politically correct.” It is a way of communicating that people with mental illness, as Pope John Paul II said, “have the inalienable right not only to be considered as an image of God and therefore as a person, but also to be treated as such.”
