PASTOR'S CORNER

Last Monday we celebrated Memorial Day. It is certainly a time to express gratitude to those who served in the Armed Services and especially those who died in combat. It is also a time to thank the staff of St. Stephen and St. Mary Cemeteries. Not only do they work hard to maintain the appearance and operation of the cemeteries, they do so with real sensitivity as befits a ministry of the Catholic Church.

Whenever I can I like to remind people that despite their long history, the cemeteries still have room to serve generations to come. You can make arrangements ahead of time and spare your loved ones the task. Secondly, the cemeteries' budget is always very tight. Not only do we have salary and benefits for four people, we regularly need to hire outside people to handle things like tree removal. For instance, the Emerald Ash Bore did significant damage to our trees. We are also charged to maintaining and slowly growing the "perpetual care fund" for the time, way in the future, when the cemeteries are no longer operational.

Please consider making a regular donation to the cemeteries to help offset these rising costs. Or, you may consider leaving something in your will. We will soon be announcing a very generous bequest to the cemeteries.

Week 5 – Fifth in a series of what our Faith Community can do to minister to those with mental illness and their families.

People with mental illness and their families often feel isolated from their faith community and thus isolated from God. Isolation is often caused by the stigma of the disease, or fear of being judged as inadequate or weak willed, or the misperception that God is punishing them because they did something wrong, or the communities misperception of what mental illness is and how it affects the individual and their families. As a healing community we can support people with mental illness and their families with unconditional non-judgmental love in the following ways: increase our awareness of mental illness and where to get help; offer prayers and support to individuals and families who are affected by mental illness; serve on parish committees for outreach to individuals and families, get involved in peer to peer ministry; and work on the justice issues affecting mental health care.

La resurrección, aquí y ahora

La mirada al futuro no debe desviar nuestra atención de las urgencias del presente: «Galileos, ¿qué hacéis ahí mirando al cielo?» (Hch 1,11). La nueva Jerusalén no vendrá llovida del cielo. Para nosotros, la resurrección no es sólo una promesa, es también una tarea, según el mandato de Jesús: «Id proclamando que el Reino de los Cielos está cerca. Curad enfermos, resucitad muertos, purificad leprosos, expulsad de-monios» (Mt 10,8). La tarea es más urgente porque vivimos en una sociedad enferma de necrofilia que hace de la muerte un espectáculo para el consumo de masas, a la vez que, incapaz de darle un sentido, rehuye y reprime el enfrentamiento personal con ella; una sociedad obsesionada por elevar su calidad de vida, pero que puede aceptar pasiva o indiferente la mortalidad infantil en el Tercer Mundo y el genocidio de minorías étnicas, el aborto, el abuso sexual y la eutanasia, el tráfico de armas y las drogas...

Frente a esta cultura de la muerte, los cristianos estamos llamados a continuar la misión sanadora y resucitadora de Jesús. La fe en la resurrección se proyecta activamente en la lucha cotidiana por la paz, la justicia y la integridad de la creación.
